

Shorts, Skorts, Dresses, Skirts, Jumpers: Length must, at minimum, touch fingertip when worn correctly on waist.

Shoes and Sandals: Shoes must have full backs or straps. Heels may not be higher than 2”.

Shirts: Shirts must **fully** cover waistband when sitting or standing. Sleeveless shirts must be tastefully fitted around the arm area

Hair (Boys and Girls): Hair must be neat, clean and out of eyes. Extremes in hairstyles or colors or not allowed.

Hats/Jackets/Sunglasses: Hats, caps, jackets and sunglasses may not be worn in the building.

Makeup: Seventh and eighth grade girls may wear tastefully-applied cosmetics. Body glitter and paint are not allowed. Lip-balm/chapstick must be translucent

Earrings: Earrings must be appropriate for a Christian environment

The following is NOT acceptable: Spaghetti-strap clothing; visible undergarments; sleepwear; tank tops; open-backed clothing; tightly-fitted clothing; spandex; low cut clothing; oversized clothing; flipflops/clogs; inappropriate language; mention of tobacco or alcohol; holes, frays, tears, or fading that accentuates body parts; writing/decorations on buttocks area; body piercings; wallet chains or pocket chains.

32.2 VIOLATIONS OF DRESS CODE

1. First offense – Conference with student and change of clothing. Student will be separated until dress attire has been modified and deemed appropriate.
2. Second offense – Detention and change of clothing.
3. Third offense – 1-day suspension.

32.0 STUDENT DRESS

We expect students to be neat, clean and dressed in good taste. A neatly-dressed student shows maturity and self-discipline, traits we wish to develop. If the weather is unseasonably warm, students may wear shorts that meet the approval of their parents and the faculty. Children should have proper clothing for outside play (hats, gloves, snow pants, coat, boots). Children are outside for recess when the temperature is 20°F or above, the wind chill is 15°F or above, and playground conditions permit safe play. Boots are necessary for playing in snow or mud. Students may not wear hats or coats during class. Students are expected to wear slacks or dresses on special occasions. Wednesdays (chapel days) have been designated as dress-up day; and students should dress more neatly that day. Dressing with dignity promotes respect.

32.1 PROPER ATTIRE GUIDELINES

The dress of students should reflect modesty and good taste becoming of a Christian. Neatness in dress and grooming promotes proper attitudes and behavior. Parents are urged to help their child select appropriate clothing. Parents will be notified about inappropriate dress or appearance. The student will not be allowed to return to the classroom until the situation is rectified. Following are guidelines for appropriate dress:
